There are now assistance programs available for GJJ people and your families that will help with funding for a range of social and cultural activities.

We look forward to working with the GJJ people to support your applications for assistance.

General rules for all the programs

This assistance is for GJJ people and your families.

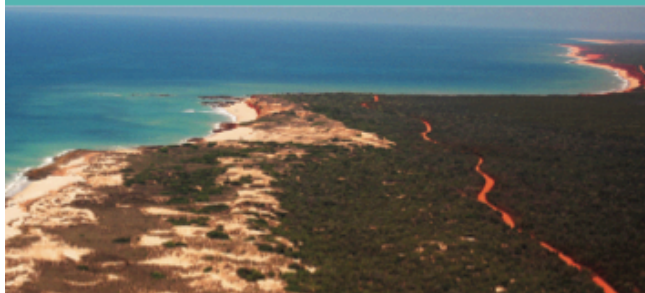
You may be asked for additional supporting information when you put your request in for assistance, if you are not already a Waardi Limited member.

Guumbarr has limited funding to support these programs so we will be making funds available every three months to make sure everyone has a fair go.

Guumbarr is required to set the budget and make sure there is a fair and even use of funds.

General rules for all the programs:

- Guumbarr will pay the business/organisation directly for supplying good or services.
- If you want, you can pay for an item that is less than \$300 and then claim the money back later. (Or you can get the office to pay the supplier directly for the item so you are not short of cash)



The Board of Guumbarr looks forward to being of assistance to the GJJ people.

These are important programs that will help people with a range of benefits for important things like education, health, training, cultural activities, and assistance for elders.

Assistance Programs

The following programs have been set up for GJJ people and your families.

You can start applying for support from our programs that include:



EDUCATION

To assist people with the costs associated with obtaining an education, including pre-school, primary and high school, tertiary, gifted and additional support.



HEALTH CARE

To assist people who require support to meet health care costs that are not covered by other sources (government, health services, clinics, private health insurance).



TRAINING

To assist people who wish to obtain qualifications or skills sets or to improve existing qualifications and skill sets in any field.



FUNERAL

To assist families with support during a time of loss.



CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

To assist families to participate in cultural activities.



ELDERS

To assist the older GJJ people 60 and over with direct support.



SPORTING AND ARTS

To assist young people to take part in sporting and art activities, where the sporting support is for the enhancement of physical well being.
